Note.—This application must be signed by the person, or his duly authorized agent, responsible for payment of rental and claims as per regulations, in the presence of, and be witnessed by, an officer of the Department, a J.E., or a Solicitor.

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To the Deputy Postmaster-General,

Note.—(a) Permission to erect a Line may not be given until the necessary fees have been paid and the Conditions of the Regulations complied with.

(b) Permission to erect a Line does not cover permission to use any such Line until the Licence to use it has been issued in accordance with the Regulations.

The Postmaster-General reserves to himself absolute power to disconnect and remove any Telephone rented in connexion with either new Telephone contracts or renewals of existing Telephone contracts if he is of opinion that it is used for betting, gaming, illegal, or improper purposes.

Copies of the Telephone Regulations may be obtained at the office of the Telephone Manager, General Post Office, or from the local Postmaster.
